








#### **Ground Floor**

- new visitor welcome, shop and cloaks




## Upper Levels & Roofscape:

- solar panels (discreetly located)




## Central zone: Arrangement

- Repair of failing roofs
- new lift (to all floors)
- · new stair down to lower ground
- new fully accessible WC facilities (incl. Changing Place)
- new light well lanterns
- discreet external plant in least visible area of roof



### Central zone: Servicing

- New services distribution across basement
- discreet external plant in least visible area of lower roof
- discreet solar panels on least visible pitches of upper roof




#### 5.0 Public Stair

#### **Concept Designs**

The historic conservation philosophy of the building – post waralso intrigues us. We have discussed the restorative approach to the building's repair with the client team and stakeholders almost as 'defiant conservation'. Interiors and exteriors are fully restored, using contemporary construction techniques, with minimal reference to the legibility of their repair.

Upon inspection, we can see 'expanded metal lath' throughout the buildings construction. Given more decorative contemporary samples of this building material, we are interested in opportunities that showcase its user perhaps denoting areas where no historic structure would originally have been as a quiet nod to its use at scale throughout the historic building.

in plan terms, we have sought to achieve open, generous landings at both ground and lower ground levels- recognising the
movement of large numer of people at this level (1). Regular intermediate landings ensure the stair is gentle enough for as many
users as posible, whilst securing head heights beneath landings
for ancillary spaces (2). To give a sense of the whole being considered together, the landern above aligns with the structure
beneath whilst allowing natrutal light down to the lower levelmuch as it historically would have done (3).
