
That Thing: Fabulous designer emporium that showcases a special festival line of fashion and accessories, such as sequin face masks and vintage finds. thatthing.co

EAT & DRINK

Sonny Stores: This corner shop gem is from ex-River Café chef Pegs Quinn. Think a sophisticated take on scrambled eggs with anchovy butter. sonnystores.com
Klosterhaus: Snap a selfie at the grand island bar in this opulent Quakers Friars building. The menu has a German accent; choose from an array of beers or opt for a Kloster fizz on the grand terrace. Lederhosen optional. klosterhaus.co.uk
Woky Ko Cargo: The freshly made bao buns by former *MasterChef* finalist Larkin Cen are a must at his award-winning Asian restaurant in Wapping Wharf. wokyko.com
Milk Thistle: Spot the tiny nameplate and press the buzzer to enter this former merchant house with its stained glass, wood panelling, leather chairs and speakeasy vibe. The Parlour bar offers over 150 cocktails while The Vault does whisky and spirits. One to book. milkthistlebristol.com
Clifton Observatory: The Rooftop Terrace of this former windmill gives fabulous views of the city's famous suspension bridge. cliftonobservatory.com

SLEEP

SEE, DO, SHOP

Somerset House: Enjoy musical bumper cars courtesy of Mercury Prize 2020 nominee Anna Meredith in a courtyard decorated by Yinka Ilori. Plus food and drink from chef Jimmy Garcia. Dodge Lates on Thursday and Friday nights also features leading DJs. somersethouse.org.uk

The Line: Walk this three-hour sculpture trail (the-line.org) from the Olympic Park, Stratford, to The O2 Arena in Greenwich and see sculptures by artists such as Anish Kapoor, Abigail Fallis and Damien Hirst. For an adrenaline rush, climb the O2 summit (Up at The O2; theo2.co.uk).

Yayoi Kusama Infinity Rooms: One of the hottest tickets in town, see two mirror room installations created by the renowned Japanese artist. tate.org.uk

Coal Drops Yard: A buzzy shopping and foodie destination on the canals of King's Cross. Shop the fashion, lifestyle, beauty and homewares stores including favourites Earl of East, Caravane and Wolf & Badger. coaldropsyard.com

Annie's Ibiza: Annie Dible's Carnaby Street spin-off of her famous Ibiza store stocks vintage clothes that major in colour, sequins and feathers. anniesibiza.com
