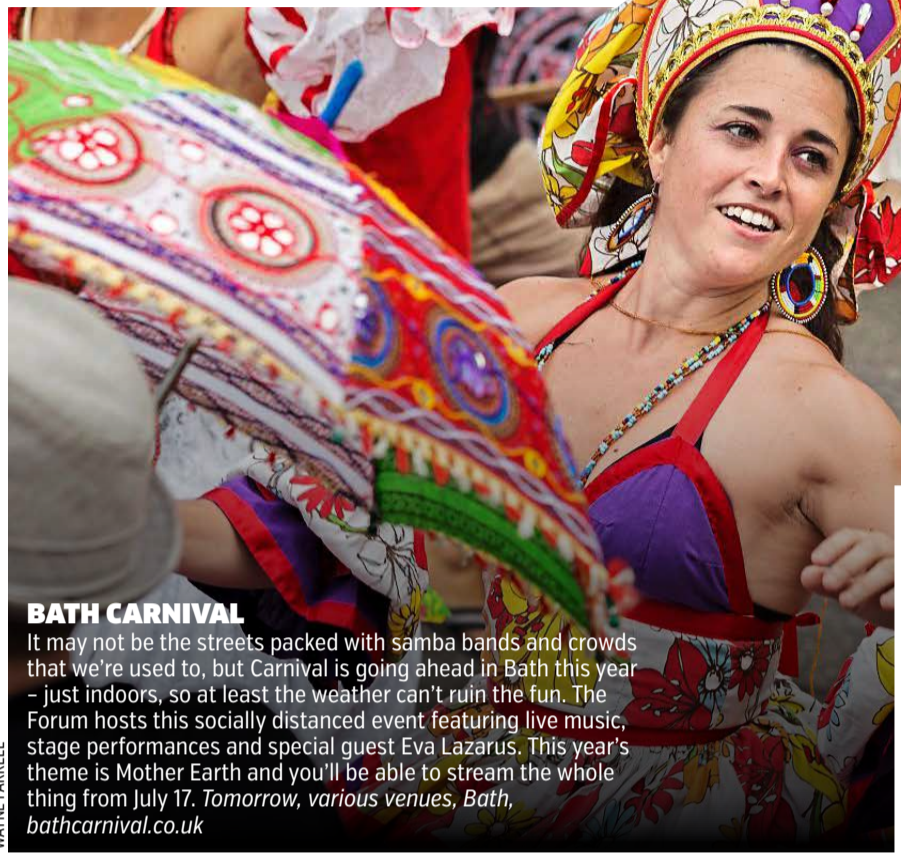

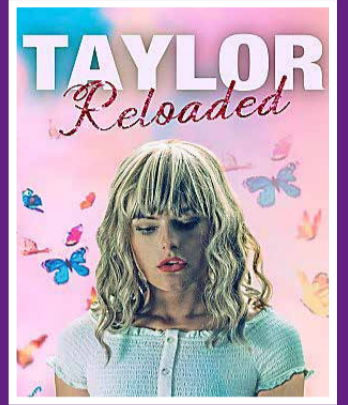

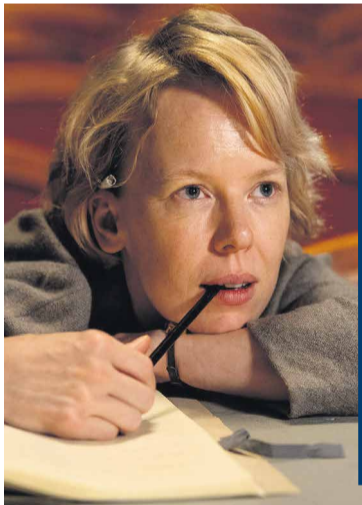
BEDMINSTER SECRET GARDENS
